Listen to the episode. Read the following questions, and write your answers in the box provided.

What is the appeal of a David and Goliath story? Write some thoughts below. Do you resonate with “the little guy” and if so, why? Is there something in your past that it touches on? If there’s some bitterness there, write it down, confess and forgive.

Reflection: Have you suffered injustice at the hands of school teachers, employers, authority figures? How did you react? How has God changed you through this/these experience(s)? Ask God for further healing or strength to forgive, if you need it. He loves you and answers those who call on him. Prayer.

Day Four

Listen to the episode. Read the following questions, and write your answers in the box provided.

The rich are guilty of hoarding in the last days. How would you define “hoarding?” If some of your behaviour fits within the definition, ask God to speak to you about what he’s calling you to do in response. Write some ideas below.

Reflection: Greed. Each of us has a different definition. Simply ask God to speak to you regarding your material possessions, and any action that he’s calling you to take. Does it involve greater giving? What about giving time to outreach in its various forms? Do you hoard your belongings and still buy more? Be open with God, and ask him to convict you and give you courage to take action. Prayer.



Day Five

Listen to the episode. Read the following questions, and write your answers in the box provided.

There's no justice in the world and there never was. Do you agree with this statement? Where do you see the most injustice today? Write some thoughts below.

Reflection: If some people are rich and some poor, then that is God's will. So be it, I am satisfied. Are you satisfied also? Is poverty an economic issue, or a justice issue? Regardless of your politics, how is God calling you to have compassion on the poor, and to work towards a world in which the poor and the weak are treated fairly? Prayer.
