



Day One

Listen to the episode. Read the following questions, and write your answers in the box provided.

How do you get on with your dad? It's easy to focus on the negative, so write at least two things for which you're thankful about your dad. What has your relationship with your dad taught you about God? (Feel free to bypass this question, if it's too painful.)

Reflection: This is not a picture of a remarkable father. This is the portrait of God, whose goodness, love, forgiveness, care and compassion have no limits at all. What does the Parable of the Prodigal Son teach you about the character of God? Write some reflections above. First, read it in Luke 15.11-32. How do you think our own experience of having a father affects how we view God? As you read the parable, ask God to reveal to you his goodness and his grace, and allow that to lead you to worship. Prayer.

Day Two

Listen to the episode. Read the following questions, and write your answers in the box provided.

So, in the Lord's Prayer, when we're called to speak the words "Hallowed be thy name," we're expressing a desire for God to demonstrate his character. In the OT, he saved his people. What aspect of God's character do you pray for him to demonstrate in our world? Write some reflections below.

Reflection: We're free to call upon God that his will be done in our world. And as we do so, we're aligning our wills to his. If you have time, listen this week to the *deovox* episode on the kingdom of heaven from the series, Matthew 1-4. Listen to Matthew 4.12-17. Choose some specific situations in your life and the lives of those you know where you long from God's will to be done, for his kingdom to come. Write them in the box above. Ask for God to give you patience as well as persistence in prayer. Prayer.
